# Branch President, president-elect attend Counterparts Meeting

Ellen DiPlacido and Loretta Seigley attended the statewide Presidents' meeting via Zoom on March 29.

Major topics discussed included Program Sharing, Summer Retreat Registration, Marketing efforts and Leadership Challenges.

Pennsylvania presidents are eager to continue program sharing among branches. During the past year, several branches (including Erie) have shared programs with other Pennsylvania branches. Advertisement and technical help are available to any branch wishing to share a program with other Pennsylvania branches.

Presidents were asked to encourage member attendance at the summer retreat "Women Together Fighting on the Front Line." The retreat will be held in Gettysburg on the campus of Gettysburg College July 28-29. Registration information is available on the AAUW Pennsylvania website.

The need for effective marketing to increase AAUW visibility was also discussed. Presidents were asked to invite members to submit brief articles to the *Keystoner*. An enewsletter focusing on branch events is under consideration. The newsletter would be available to all members.

Leadership challenges currently experienced by Pennsylvania branches was a topic of major concern. Several branches have been unable to identify individuals who will agree to accept board positions. Branches have adapted either by electing two individuals to share one position (co-presidents for example), or by operating as a branch with a leadership committee rather than individual board members. The need to revise position descriptions was discussed. In some instances, position descriptions contain outdated language and can appear overwhelming. Presidents discussed the need to define "What is our essential Mission?" and to focus on essential elements to avoid burnout.

Presidents were requested to encourage members to attend the AAUW PA business meeting via Zoom on May 9.
